The Awareness Programme began at 11:00 AM with welcoming guests and Introduction to the themes of the programme by Smt. Anindita Sarkar, Assistant Professor in English Language Teaching. The Keynote Address began at 11:10 AM delivered by the Deputy Director of Jalpaiguri Regional Centre, Shri Santanu Dam. The speaker emphasised on the importance of sensitising the learners enrolled under Netaji Subhas Open University about the Open and Distance Learning Mode.
